At the April 24, 1996 Bunnell FFA Chapter meeting, members voted to charge a small fee for individuals to keep their projects at our livestock facilities. The \$10.00/animal fee will assist in maintaining the facilities, as well as for repairing and replacing equipment. Livestock pens will be assigned on a first come first served basis, with applications and fees being accepted at the beginning May 1st of each year. Members that participate may be asked to participate in the care and feeding of the chapter animals, but each member is responsible for the care and feeding of their own animals. Please read the requirements of this agreement, failure to adhere to them will result in your eviction from the facility. A participants meeting will be scheduled in the fall. Attendance is required for the member and at least one parent/guardian.

The **Student** is responsible for the care and management of their projects. Their responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- 1. **Daily** care and feeding of their own animal(s). Animals must be fed on a **consistent** and **daily basis**. If you are unable to feed you must make other arrangements in advance.
- 3. **Signing** in each day as directed. (Failure to do so is the same as not being there.) Note all animals that you cared for, even if you fed for someone else.
- 4. Removal of trash from the facilities. (Feed bags, drink & food containers, shampoo bottles, broken equipment, etc.) WE DO NOT HAVE COUNTY TRASH PICK UP, YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR OWN TRASH)
- 5. **Supervising** any visitors. You are responsible for their well-being as well as the well being of the facilities and the animals housed there.
- 6. Treating all animals and equipment with respect.
- 7. **No dogs are allowed at the farm.** Dogs may be confined to your vehicle *briefly* while caring for your project provided that they are calm and the outside temperatures are not extreme.
- 8. Notify Mrs. Davis of any unsafe or questionable conditions. (Including low feed supplies)
- 9. Keeping ALL Gates Shut.
- 10. Not handling projects owned by others, unless they have asked you to and Mrs. Davis approves it. (Including Chapter owned animals with out Mrs. Davis's permission)
- 11. **Not** using other's **equipment/supplies** without their **permission**. (Including equipment/supplies belonging to the Chapter.)
- 12. **Returning all equipment** to its proper location.
- 13. Lock gate when leaving. (Even if you think you will only be gone for a few minutes.)
- 14. Follow ALL SAFETY practices including but not limited to wearing closed in shoes (NOT CROCS) any time you enter the livestock enclosures. (Closed in shoes are recommended for all activities at the farm and are REQUIRED when entering the small gates entering the swine barn, the small gate between the feed room and the animal area as well as anytime you are working with an animal.)

Project Conclusion Upon removal of the animals from the facility the members must clean the pens by the deadline or \$25.00 per pen will be deducted from their fair check. In the case of animals that are not sold through the fair, the fee will be submitted as a debt to the school.

- A. **Swine** pens must be cleaned within **1 week** of the animal's removal from the facility.
- B. All others must be cleaned within 3 weeks of the animal's removal from the farm.
- C. All **waste**, **bedding** (including sand as directed by Mrs. Davis) must be properly disposed of. Cattle and Goat pens must be stripped of all waste and wet spots, then leveled. It is not necessary to refill the sand.
- D. All member owned feeders, waters and equipment must be removed. (Anything left behind after the deadline will be considered a donation to the chapter.)
- E. Any equipment borrowed from the chapter must be cleaned and returned.
- F. Concrete floored pens must be bleached or **otherwise disinfected**.
